## Enhanced Login Security has arrived at First National Bank



Studies show time and time again that identity fraud happens much more often offline than online. However, we feel it is important that you have the information necessary to safely conduct your business online. Follow this guide to learn how to **prevent**, **detect**, **correct** and **report** online fraud and identify theft. We will focus on prevention, the most critical element to avoiding online fraud, in this communication; however, more information on each of the four areas can be found on our company website under the heading Online Security.

### General prevention points:

- Shred anything containing personal or financial information. Do not throw it in the trash.
- Protect your Social Security Number. Do not carry it with you or write it down.
- Be certain who you are talking to before giving any information over the phone.
- **Never** click on links sent in **unsolicited** emails. Instead, type in a web address you are already familiar with. You will notice there are no active links in this email.
- Create good passwords. Do not use your birth date, child's name, your Social Security Number, date of birth, or similar easy to guess passwords.
- Keep personal info in a secure place at home.
- Use only secure web pages when ordering online. Look for padlock in lower left corner.
- Place a Fraud Alert on your credit reports, and review them carefully.
- Always sign off from your Online Banking session and close all browsers.
- Never open files with 2 extensions such as filename.doc.pif.
- Never open files ending in .exe, .pif, or .vbs. They can be extremely dangerous.
- Be selective which websites you share your email address to limit junk mail.
